Year 4 Curriculum Information for Autumn Term 2

| | Theme – Wonder |
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| English | We are starting the term with some descriptive writing based around Bonfire night. We will then be writing to entertain, linked to our book Wonder, using the poem 'Still I Rise'. We will also be writing to inform as we are writing speeches on the importance of kindness. In reading, children will be developing their inference skills, deepening their vocabulary whilst clarifying, questioning and predicting on content using stories as well as non-fiction texts. |
| Maths | We will start the term with a recap on Addition methods and then move onto subtraction methods. During the term, we will also be learning about length and perimeter and will start our multiplication unit before Christmas. Children will also be learning multiplication facts for the times tables up to 12x12. TT Rockstars and daily times tables sessions will be used to help us improve our times tables. |
| Science | This half term we are learning all about electricity. |
| History | We will learn about the Gunpowder plot in the first week back and also learn 'Why it is important to Remember them' in the week running up to remembrance day. |
| Design and Technology | We will be designing, creating and evaluating Christmas crafts in the weeks leading up to Christmas. The children will also make Diva pots in RE as a part of their learning around the Hindu festival, Diwali. |
| Computing | We will be completing the unit 'We are software developers' this half term. |
| Art | As artists we will be practising our sketching skills and then move onto creating Bonfire art using a range of media and also some pop art linked with our topic, Wonder. |
| RE | Children will be learning about festivals in religion and then advent and the Christmas story in December. |
| PSHE | We will be learning all bullying, peer pressure, celebrating differences and the importance of Kindness. |
| French | The children will be completing the unit Les Calendrier de fete (Holiday calendar) |
| Music | Children will learn about rhythm, pitch and pulse as we study and learn the song '5 gold rings'. |
| P.E. | The children will be learning the game of handball in indoor PE and they will also learn communication skills and tactics in Outdoor adventure activities. |

PE for year 4

Monday afternoon – Outdoor PE Tuesday morning – Indoor PE

Next half term, children need to bring their PE kit in on Monday and leave it in school till a Friday. Jewellery

For reasons of health and safety we do not allow children to wear jewellery in our school. The exception to this rule is that children with pierced ears may wear ear studs, one per ear and these MUST be removed for any physical activity in school.

It is not permissible to cover earrings with tape.

If children are unable to take ear studs out themselves they should be left at home on PE /swimming days.

School staff are not allowed to remove or replace earrings.

How can I help at home?

-Label all belongings clearly. Any uniform left at the end of the day will be placed in the Lost Property box in the cloakrooms. Periodically, this will be emptied and any unclaimed clothing of a reasonable quality will be donated to charity.

-Monitor the amount of time your child spends reading and record this in their reading log. Ask them questions about their reading to ensure they are reading for understanding. Suggestions for this are in the parents' section of the school website.

-Support your child with their times tables through regular practice – TT Rockstars supports this. -Speak to the class teacher and ask how you can help if you have any concerns.

-Encourage your child to be independent, with a successful approach to learning.

-Children are expected to bring in a healthy snack such as fruit. Please ensure that these are nut free.
