Earlier this year, children from year 5 and 6 were invited to complete applications for the role of Lunch time Buddies, and say why they felt they would make a good Buddy.



They have been carrying out this role since Easter and have been amazing—supporting younger children in the dining room and on the playgrounds at lunch time, helping children to have a positive dining experience and engage in positive play during lunch time.

This is what staff have to say:

"It has been lovely to see the year 5 and 6 children interacting, leading games and helping the children solve problems. The EYFS children get very excited to see them and look up to their positive behaviour."

"In the canteen the children who support are incredible, nothing is too much trouble! They're lovely with the younger children, taking time to talk to them as well as support any needs. Their mature attitude to any incident is excellent as they work as a team to support where necessary. "

"These lunch time buddies are amazing! They are so good with the children. One of them rang the bell today to ask if anyone would like to play stuck in the mud and lots of children came running over. They all looked like they were having lots of fun. Also two buddies found some missing jumpers for me on Wednesday."

"Can I give a shout out to two girls from 6EW, they have been amazing. My class are always singing their praises and they always come feedback to me if any issues."

"The year 6 play leaders in KS1 playground were exceptional today. They used the huge parachute and with very little adult support entertained approximately 60 children for over 40 minutes without injury or arguments!! What was especially lovely was that some of our children who wouldn't usually be involved were central to inclusion and showed visible joy amongst such a large group. The children used silent stop cues to secure attention, gave clear brief instructions for each game and showed real concern for equality and fairness. The KS1 children worked as a team, and got super gross motor, proprioceptive and social interaction 'therapy'. The result was not only beneficial for those joining in, but the others who usually have a very busy space had so much more space and appeared much more relaxed."

"When the buddies help out in the dining hall they are a great help!"

"It's giving the children the sense of responsibility. I don't remind them to go - the list is up on the board, and they seem to be managing to organise themselves. They are showing a level of maturity and independence - what they need for secondary school!"
