#### Message from the Headteacher

A very quick 5 weeks has passed us by and we have achieved so much in such a short space of time. Standards in school are rising quickly, children are meeting the enhanced expectations we are placing upon them and staff are, as always doing an incredible job every day.

We still await our scheduled OFSTED inspection and do expect this to take place before April. We are confident that school will be looked at in a positive way in terms of the progress we have made as a school in all areas. All staff in school have contributed to a period of rapid development, it's not always been plain sailing but together we have achieved so much and will continue to achieve so much by sticking together and aiming for excellence in all we do.

Attendance at our school still remains below the national average for all primary schools. Unfortunately, I have sent out over 100 attendance letters this half term to parents of children where attendance is below 90%. A reminder that if your child's attendance is below 90%, this is classed as persistent absence by the Department for Education. It is hoped that with better weather and the cold and flu season passing us that all children move towards having attendance over 90% but ultimately aiming for above 95% as a school average.


Staff shoutouts—Safeguarding and SEND team.

#### **Uniform Expectations**

After careful consideration of both the pros and cons of this, we have decided to revert back to our children being in PE uniform on PE days. This change will be implemented immediately after the half term holiday.

Pe Uniform being:

- Plain white polo shirt or t-shirt
- Navy or Black shorts (or jogging bottoms)
- Navy blue sweatshirt (not hooded)
- Trainers
- Socks
- Children with long hair must have it tied up in a bobble

• If children wear earrings, these should be removed on PE days if the child is unable to remove them independently. Alternatively, tape can be worn over earrings and this should be worn all day. Tape cannot be provided by school.

Why the change?

1. Changing time in school can take a large chunk out of the time allocated for physical education learning.

- 2. Changing often also means children losing uniform.
- 3. No bags being left in the cloakrooms (less cluttered space for the children).

4. Currently investigating the feasibility of moving all coat pegs to the corridors to enable the 4 large spaces that would remain to be developed as additional learning spaces for the children.

Your child(s) class teacher will inform you regularly of PE days and this is always on our Friday information letter from the school office.

Children who attend a sports club after school, must wear school uniform and will get changed after school.
