## Increase In School Meal Charges & Breakfast Club Charges From September 2025:

Please note that following the increase in charges for our catering from NYC, we are increasing the cost of a pupil school dinner from September to £3.50 per meal (£17.50 for the week). This is after a small subsidy by school, to keep the charge as low as possible for parents. Payments should be made in advance via ParentPay, our online secure payment system. If you have not yet set up a ParentPay account, please contact the school office.

There will also be an increase to the cost of Breakfast club to £4.00 per session.


